1. Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society was founded in 1937 (Nov. 26).
2. Alpha Kappa Mu was founded at Tennessee State A&I College.
(College/University)
3. Alpha Kappa Mu grew out of an idea conceived by George W. Gore.
4. Alpha Kappa Mu was admitted to membership in the Association of College Honor Societies (ACHS) in 1952.
5. Dr. George W. Gore, Jr. served as Executive Secretary-Treasurer of Alpha Kappa Mu for 25 years.
6. Dr. Gore was succeeded in the above position by Thomas J. Crawford.
7. The Office of the Executive Secretary-Treasurer is currently located in Albany, GA and the Executive Secretary-Treasurer is Dr. Mollie B. Brown.
8. The third Executive Secretary-Treasurer was Ann W. McKinney Morris.
9. The first female to serve as President of Alpha Kappa Mu Society was Jeanette Cole.
10. Alpha Kappa Mu is divided into 8 regions. w/some regions now divided--A & B)
11. Each region is headed by a/an Regional Director.
12. The mission of Alpha Kappa Mu is symbolized by 5 candles.
13. The white (color) stands for character.
14. The yellow stands for scholarship.
15. The red stands for citizenship.
16. The blue stands for service.
17. The green stands for leadership.
18. The words of the Alpha Kappa Mu Hymn were written by Pearl Gore (wife of founder, George W. Gore)
19. The minimum grade point average for induction into membership in Alpha Kappa Mu is 3.3 undergrad/3.7 graduate
20. Regional Meetings of Alpha Kappa Mu should be held biennially (even years)
(how often)
21. National Conventions are held biennially.
22. The insignia of Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society is in the form of a/an key.
23. The colors of the Society are royal blue and white.
24. The Third Annual Convention of Alpha Kappa Mu was held at Arkansas A&M State, Pine Bluff

25. The Society was first named Federation of Honor Societies.
26. An undergraduate chapter of the Society may be established at any 4- year degree granting college or institution which is fully accredited by an appropriate national or regional accrediting agency.
27. A petition for a charter for a chapter must contain 7 or more names.
28. Chapters are named with Greek letters in alphabetical order according to the time of the installations.
29. Membership in the Society is via induction as a/an (a) collegiate member, (b) alumni member, (c) honorary (local & laureate) member or (d) life member.
30. A student who transfers to a new institution must have earned at least 30 semester hours at the new institution to be eligible for induction.
31. The Key of Alpha Kappa Mu is engraved with the letters AKM, a/an torch, a/an open book and a/an quill.
32. Dr. Gore stepped down as Executive Secretary-Treasurer in 1974 at the 36th Annual Meeting of the Society held at Kentucky State Univ. (1974) (college/university).
33. Dr. Gore was voted Emeritus Status and made a Life Member of the Executive Council.
34. Mr. T. J. Crawford was voted Emeritus Status and made a Life Member of Executive Council.
35. Dr. Ann W. Morris was voted Emeritus Status and made a Life Member of Executive Council.
36. Dr. Jeannette L. Cole was made a Life Member of Executive Council.
37. The Cultural Events Program which is held at each of the National Conventions are named for and honor George E. Loder and John W. Riley.
38. The National Scholarship for Alpha Kappa Mu is named for George W. Gore and Thomas J. Crawford.
39. Two National Scholarships are awarded annually in the amount of \$2000.00 each.
40. The Society was incorporated in 1977 (Sept. 7) under the laws of the State of South Carolina.
